STICKY KNOWLEDGE

World War 1 began in 1914 and ended in 1918.	All men aged between 18 and 41 had to go to war. Some boys were as young as 14.
The poppy is the symbol of World War 1.	On Christmas Day 1914 there was a truce.
The assassination of Archduke Ferdinand was one of the reasons that the war happened.	The Armistice was on 11/11/1918 and on 11th November each year we hold a 2 minute silence to remember those who died.
Germany invaded Belgium so Britain declared war on Germany.	1 million people were killed or injured in the Battle of the Somme in 1916.



VOCABULARY

Allies	A group of countries - Britain and the British Empire, France, Belgium, Russia and later USA - who fought against the Central Powers.
Armistice	An agreement made by sides in a war to stop fighting.
Central Powers	A group of countries - Germany, Austria-Hungary, and Turkey - who fought against the Allies.
Front line	The part of an army that is closest to the enemy.
No Man's Land	Land between the front lines of two opposing armies.
Trench	A long, narrow ditch dug into the ground where the soldiers lived.
Triple Entente	A group made up of France, Britain and Russia.
Truce	An agreement between enemies to stop fighting for a certain amount of time.
