Concept: symbolism

Charity	an organization set up to provide help and raise money for those in need.
Zakat	payment made annually under Islamic law on certain kinds of property and used for charitable and religious purposes, one of the Five Pillars of Islam.
Poverty	the state of being extremely poor.



Zakat — giving a portion of one's income, usually one fortieth, to help the poor. This creates a bond between rich and poor and helps Muslims to purify their wealth and keep away from greed. It is usually paid once a year.	Most faiths give their followers guidance on social issues such as inequality.
